Mayor's Letter

Summer will soon be in full swing and on cue the first weekend of this month brings our RiverFest and Craft Show. We have booked the most vendors we have had in recent memory and there are a number of individual events that we have incorporated into the show. Among these is the annual Duck Splash race, which will take place on Sunday, June 2. Tickets for this are on sale online until Friday, May 31, and will be on sale thereafter during the show. Other events include boat tours, a boat parade, a beer garden, and more. A significant amount of information about RiverFest is contained in this newsletter and on the town web site. Most importantly I would like to encourage you to attend and patronize vendors, and if possible, volunteer. As I often remind folks, this and our fall show are significant sources of funding for town capital projects and other special initiatives and thus help keep our real estate property tax rate low.

Speaking of tax rates, last month the Town Council passed the budget and tax rates for fiscal year 2025, which begins on July 1. There were no adjustments to our existing tax rates.

In addition to RiverFest, the town hosts two other events this month. On Friday, June 14, we will hold our monthly Trivia Night in River Mill Park. The theme for the night is "To Quiz or Not to Quiz." On the following night, Saturday the 15th, we will continue our free summer concert series in River Mill Park, with the band, "Hand Painted Swinger."

Last this month I would like to encourage waterfront property owners to check out the Virginia Department of Forestry Program described elsewhere in this newsletter. Through this program, waterfront property owners can assist in reducing erosion and corresponding sedimentation of the Occoquan River.

Riparian Forests for Landowners Program

The Virginia Department of Forestry (DOF) is offering a Riparian Forest for Landowners Program, where a no-cost riparian forest buffer will be installed covering the planning, site preparation, and planting, as well as one year of Maintenance. The program will be open to private property owners with land adjacent to a water feature, including homeowner's associations.

A Riparian Forest Buffer is a wooded area adjacent to a water feature to help allow sediment to settle out of the water and reducing excess nutrients from runoff.

The funding for this program is from the Inflation Reduction Act through the USDA Forest Service and the Commonwealth of Virginia's Water Quality Improvement Fund Act.

Sign-ups for this program will continue until the funding is depleted. To learn more and to apply please visit:
