
Mayor's Letter

Thank you everyone for your patience as we began the replacement and repair of our antiquated and deteriorating stormwater system. The most recent project directly impacted Union and Commerce Streets and was funded by a state appropriation secured for us by Delegate Luke Torian. Future improvements are to be funded by a federal appropriation secured by Congresswoman Abigail Spanberger. We are grateful to both for having obtained the funds needed to make these necessary projects financially feasible for us.

As this issue is going to print we have been informed that a drought "Watch" has been declared for northern Virginia, including the Town of Occoquan, due to unusually dry conditions. This is the first time since the relevant regional plan was adopted in 2011 that a "Watch" has been declared. A drought Watch is a step short of a drought Warning, which could entail potentially mandatory water restrictions. Although there is currently an adequate supply of water in the Potomac River and backup reservoirs, everyone is encouraged to implement voluntary water conservation measures to help ease pressure on the system.

This month in Occoquan we will once again have multiple events. August 6 is National Night Out and the Occoquan Police Department will be holding an open house under the Route 123 bridge from 6-9 p.m. On August 9, we will hold our monthly Trivia Night in River Mill Park, with the theme, Risky Quizness. Then, on August 17, we will have a free concert in the park from 7-9 as part of our Music on Mill series, this time with the band "Side Piece."

To close this month I want to congratulate Brandon D'Andrea, who was the winner of this year's name the island contest, where we each year at RiverFest solicit potential names for the former 19th century Army Corp of Engineers dike that is now an island under the Route 123 bridge. Known as "Heron's Haven" for the past year, the island will be called "Craighill Isle" for the next, the name of the Army Corp officer who supervised the dike project in the late 19th century. You'll have the opportunity to indulge in festival fare and enjoy live music in the **Beer Garden** in River Mill Park. Kids will want to stop by **Imagination Alley** to create their own art at the Art Bar! The Fall Arts & Crafts Show is free admission, though the shuttle service is \$8, round trip. Craft Show Volunteer Opportunities

Shuttle Stop - Volunteers ensure that each patron over 12 that rides the shuttle has paid the round-trip fare upon drop off at the festival and receives a stamp allowing them into the show and indicating what stop to which they should return in order to board the shuttle back.

Vendor Assist - Volunteers are asked to "booth sit" for vendor breaks.

Imagination Alley - Volunteers will assist at the Art Bar and with set and clean up.

Volunteer Coordinator - Our coordinator will check in volunteers and troubleshoot shifts as necessary.

Breakfast - Our volunteer will set up breakfast, trouble shoot and restock as necessary, and greet vendors with a smile.

Information Booth - Volunteers answer questions for festival patrons and share the many fun things happening throughout the year.

Set Up - Saturday morning set up includes helping staff set tables, tents, and chairs in River Mill Park and at the shuttle stops.

Break Down - Sunday afternoon break down includes helping staff breaking down tables, tents, and chairs.
