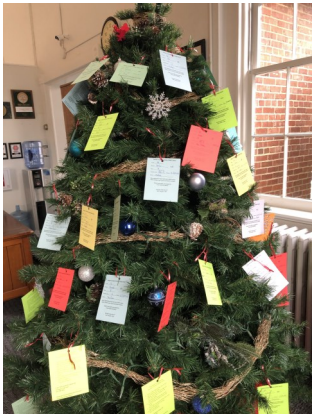
Also this month I would like to remind folks about the annual test of the Occoquan Dam warning siren by Fairfax Water. The test is scheduled for 10:00 a.m. on November 20, 2024, and more information can be found at www.occoquandamsiren.com.

By now many of you will have noticed some new 20 mph speed limit signs on a short stretch of Washington Street. Under authority recently granted by the state, the town has chosen to lower the speed limit in this high traffic area, which too often witnesses unsafe speeds of 30 mph or more, to enhance safety for school bus stops and the two pedestrian crosswalks. As these are town signs, not VDOT signs, we eventually plan to outline them in lights that will help alert people to the presence of pedestrians in the nearby crosswalks. Together we believe these measures will help enhance safety along this stretch of Washington Street, which has been a long-time concern of some town residents.
