Public Hearings: May 6 (Budget) and May 20 (Tax Rates)

Budget and Tax Rate Adoption: May 20

The FY 2026 Budget is effective from July 1, 2025 through June 30, 2026. The budget guides the Town's daily activities, as well as larger capital improvement projects over the next year. The public is encouraged to attend work sessions, as well as provide feedback and comments during the public hearings. All meetings are held at Town Hall, 314 Mill Street, beginning at 7 p.m. Budget work sessions presentations, and once finalized, the proposed budget, are available online at www.occoquanva.gov.
