


Town Council Actions: May 2025

Mayor's Letter

Welcome to a full-blown spring, everyone, with sunshine, rain, flowers, pollen, and lots of outdoor events. Among the last is our upcoming RiverFest & Craft Show, which as always will take place on the first full weekend in June — this year that's the 7th & 8th. Like our fall show, this is an important source of revenue for town capital projects, so please try to take some time to patronize some of the nearly 300 vendors and help make the event a success. Of course, don't forget that the 17th Annual Duck Splash Race is part of the fun. We also could still use volunteers to help out, so please check out the information elsewhere in this newsletter and on the town web site for more on vendors, street closures, volunteer needs, and everything else.

Last month the town council held public hearings and voted on the tax rates and budget for fiscal year 2026, which begins July 1. All tax rates remain the same, with the exception of a new levy on retail cigarette sales (of which there are currently none) that brings us in line with other Virginia jurisdictions. Check out the town web site for detailed information on the budget and tax rates, as well as on a series of recommendations from the Planning Commission compiled over a year's time that are helping guide town planning.

There are a number of organizations and businesses I would like to congratulate this month. First, I would like to congratulate two new(ish) businesses in town. To Bee, opened on May 11 on 308 Poplar Alley, and Leaf & Petal, re-opened at their new location at 204 Washington Street. We appreciate both of you choosing to locate in Occoquan. Second, I want to once again thank VFW Post 7916 for their role in placing the military tribute banners throughout town beginning on Memorial Day weekend. These banners are now a great town tradition that honors our veterans.

Last, don't forget that on Friday, June 20, we have our monthly Trivia Night in River Mill Park, where the theme this month is the Great Brain Bake-Off (and I, too, have no idea what that means). Get ready for a vibrant weekend at RiverFest, where the historic district transforms into a lively hub of creativity and family fun! The event will be held on both **Saturday and Sunday from 10 am to 5pm, June 7 & 8**. Nearly 300 vendors, including talented artisans, line the streets, showcasing their unique arts and crafts.

The annual **Duck Splash** hosted by Patriots for Disabled Divers will take place on **Sunday, June 8 at 12 pm!** Exclusively during RiverFest weekend, Carefree Boat Club will be offering 45-minute **boat tours** on the Occoquan River. Head over to **Conservation Alley** for demonstrations, recycled crafts, music, and plenty of love for the natural world. Through the **Jr. Passport** program, kids can earn a Conservation Alley sticker badge while learning simple ways to protect our wildlife and water. River Mill Park, with its spectacular views of the river, will hold the **Beer Garden** and **Live Music**. Ample seating makes this a great place to take a break, grab a drink, and enjoy food from the food court.
