At its May 20, 2025 meeting, the Occoquan Town Council adopted the Town's FY 2026 Budget and Tax Rates following two public hearings.

The FY 2026 Budget maintains the Real Estate Tax Rate of \$0.116 per \$100 of assessed value with a due date of December 5th each year. The Meals Tax Rate was maintained at 3.5% and the Transient Tax Rate was maintained at 7%. The Adopted Budget is available online at occoquanva.gov.
