At the time I am writing, the heat has been brutal for an extended period. When you receive this, hopefully we will have experienced some relief; nevertheless I encourage you to continue to take appropriate precautions and be alert for others who might be in distress.

Speaking of the heat, because of it we had to postpone our July Trivia Night in River Mill Park. As a result, we will have two trivia nights in August — one on August 1 and the regularly-scheduled event on August 15. We always have fun at trivia nights, so we hope you will take an opportunity to participate or watch some of the action.

In August we will also feature a first-time event in Occoquan, our Snakehead Roundup, which will take place in River Mill Park on Sunday, August 3, from 8:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m. This unique event for the town will bring attention to legal fishing practices, open a normally off-limits area for anglers, and help curb an invasive species that happens to be good eating. Then on August 5, our police department and other first responders will participate in the National Night Out from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. in the Route 123 bridge parking lot. Snakehead Roundup

The Town of Occoquan, Virginia will permit fishing exclusively for northern snakehead fish in **River Mill Park on Sunday, August 3 between 8 pm to 11 pm.**

In this pilot event, licensed fishers will be encouraged to catch and kill the **invasive** northern snakehead species from the River Mill Park area of town. Town staff and police will provide on-site monitoring to ensure compliance with all rules, public safety, and park integrity.

Craft Show Volunteer Opportunities

- Shuttle Stop** - Volunteers ensure that each patron over 12 that rides the shuttle has paid the round-trip fare upon drop off at the festival and receives a stamp allowing them into the show and indicating what stop to which they should return in order to board the shuttle back.
- Vendor Assist** - Volunteers are asked to "booth sit" for vendor breaks.
- Imagination Alley** - Volunteers will assist at the Art Bar and with set and clean up.
- Volunteer Coordinator** - Our coordinator will check in volunteers and troubleshoot shifts as necessary
- Breakfast** - Our volunteer will set up breakfast, trouble shoot and restock as necessary, and greet vendors with a smile
- Information Booth** - Volunteers answer questions for festival patrons and share the many fun things happening throughout the year.
- Set Up** - Saturday morning set up includes helping staff set tables, tents, and chairs in River Mill Park and at the shuttle stops.
- Break Down** - Sunday afternoon break down includes helping staff breaking down tables, tents, and chairs.
